From Bauer:

- 1. What did Octavian do to demonstrate that the Roman Republic had been given a "fresh start"? What actions did he previously take to demonstrate that he never intended to share power?
- 2. Rome formed the Praetorian Guard under Augustus, which was the first standing army that Rome had in the city itself. How may a standing army at the command of a sole ruler infringe on individual liberties?
- 3. Augustus is the first Roman leader we have read about that could admit to the farce of the Republic. However, he went to extreme lengths in order to preserve the façade of a Rome run by the people. What did the title "Augustus" mean to Octavian, and why was it important for him not to think of himself as a "prince" but as First Citizen?
